## First Sunday of Lent, Year C 9 March 2025


#### Reflection

The Gospel for the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday of Lent tells the story of the temptation of Jesus by Satan. Over 40 days of fasting, the devil entices Jesus with offers of comfort, power and prestige. At each opportunity, Jesus responds with Scripture and reaffirms his commitment to God's will.

Temptations are opportunities for our spiritual growth; the more we overcome temptation, the more we grow in spiritual strength. Jesus used his faith and knowledge of Scripture to hold fast to his convictions and not fall prey to the temptations the Devil laid out in front of him.

We face temptations every day. We may feel the desire for a higher social status, prestige and recognition, satisfaction of the body or an appetite for power and financial wealth. Temptations lead to the desire for instant gratification. A lack of self-control can cause us to fall even deeper to the things that tempt us. It can lead to uncontrolled behaviour, abuse, overspending, excess consumption and often greed.

But temptations are not sins. What matters is what we do with them. Overcome, they make us stronger in our following of Christ. Succumbed to, they make us slaves worshipping the devil, whose "works and empty promises" we are called to renounce - at baptism and during this Lenten season. Christ shows us we are not alone.
